- 1 First of all,  I'd like to thank you for inviting me to debate this crucial issue.
- 2 It's widely known that  the rare Great Bustard bird has been reintroduced into England.
- 3 However,  how many of you knew that it was once considered extinct? That its survival is not guaranteed? Or that its size makes it an easy target for hunters?
