Tess Novel:1891

- >Realism.
- > Her problem is that she is way too beautiful, men objectify her.
- >The Extreme anger of the Realist.
- >Nature is against them.
- >Solution is selling their daughter to a rich family.
- > Tess responds to the world as a Romantic.
- >She doesn't realize the effect that her beauty has on others.
- > people want to protect her 'innocence'.
- >A creature of Naturalism.

Living in a determined world, we don't choose, we aren't free to make choices> The surroundings affect her and her destiny. Everything that happens to her is chosen by people around her.

1859 The origin of species.

She has a strange name, "Duberville"> aristocratic family inspired.

- >Family Selection: Changing their fate.
- >she can't handle ambiguity.
- >destined to be lost.
- >she always makes the wrong decisions.

>she finds her solution through Nature: the idea of Nature bringing Alex and Tess together.

D.H Lawrence.

- -The accomplishments of human rights after the first world war.
- > out of anger, and that the world is going to explode and change.
- >Modernist Literary novel, and realist.
- > Labor payments.

- >People were interested in Movies, that is why novels were kind of neglected.

- >we are subjective and artistic.
- >Family: the mother won't let her children go.
- > Ownership is the problem of her existence, she doesn't own her house but she does own her children.

Sons And Lovers- D.H Lawerence.

- >He describes life in a natural way.
- >working class story.
- >They were against Victorian age values.
- >Freedom to write about new things, highly influenced by Freud, Marx, and Darwin himself.
- >The Oedipus complex.
- ><u>Stream of Consciousness:</u> getting into the mind of a specific character from within, by understanding them psychologically.
- >Epiphany: A sudden realization, insight on things in life.
- ><u>Interior Monologue:</u> the reader is allowed access to the mind of the character.
- ><u>The Motifs:</u> characters representing something, and double motifs are when we contrast them.
- > <u>Autobiographical novel:</u> Autobiographical fiction novels.
- ><u>Bildungsroman novel:</u> a young person coming of age in understanding themselves.
- > Kunstler roman novel: the artist grows but does not accept.
- >The aesthetic distance: the relationship between the writer and the reader. (believing it or being drawn into the novel).

-<u>Is Sons and Lovers a modernist novel?</u>

It is probably dealing with eternal themes.

Modernism:

- -The individual/ as in individualism.(Fast changing world, such as Industrialization). Life is changing very quickly, so adaptation seems hard for them.
- -Experiments/ The absurd world.
- -Symbolism.
- -Art is something that can be created, there is no formal structure to it.

The Quiet American: a fascinating novel.
